
## APPENDIX A: Vocabulary Warm-up Example A

Depending on the level of the class, students might need to familiarize themselves with certain vocabulary present in the defusal manual. This can be done in a variety of ways, but a simple method would be to input any necessary vocabulary and definitions into a free online crossword puzzle creator (e.g., www.puzzle-maker.com/CW). Students could then fill out the puzzle in the traditional form by writing the words associated with each written definition:

- 9 A small, circular object which activates a machine when pressed


## DOWN

## APPENDIX B: Vocabulary Warm-up Example B

Alternatively, for a more interactive activity practicing description and circumlocution, pairs of students could be provided with two copies of the puzzle, each of which has been half filled in but without any written definitions. Students would then have to ask one another for the solution to the blanks they don't have, creating definitions as necessary.
