APPENDIX: Practice Questions

This fortune teller game can be used to practice asking questions using any future tense.

Suggested language structure

- How much/many [items] . . .
- What kind/type/sort of [item] . . .
- Who/What/When/Where . . .
- . . . will I/am I going to . . .
- . . . be [verb + –ing] . . .
- . . . have [verb + past participle] . . .
- . . . when/after/before/by the time [time]?

Some examples using simple future tense

- How much money will I have when I am 60 years old?
- What kind of car will I have when I am 60 years old?
- Who will I marry?
- Who am I going to marry?

Some examples using future progressive tense

- How much money will I be making when I am 60 years old?
- What kind of car will I be driving when I am 60 years old?
- Where will I be working?
- Where will I be living after I retire?

Some examples using future perfect tense

- How much money will I have made when I am 60 years old?
- What kind of car will I have bought when I am 60 years old?
- Will I have gotten married by the time I am 60 years old?
- Will I have visited Antarctica before I die?

Suggested topics and verbs

- housing, money, jobs → live, own, build, start (job/business), buy, promote, fire, retire
- family, wedding, children \rightarrow have (something/children), meet, marry, adopt
- health, death → get (illness), die, outlive
- travel, free time, hobbies \rightarrow do, visit, eat, finish, write, make, find

Possible special vocabulary and idioms

crystal ball, foresee, predict, bucket list, kicked the bucket, breadwinner, mortgage, retirement
