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# Classroom Practice

## Assessment With Heart: Learning From Students' Stories

Throughout my 20 years of teaching different languages, I have adapted my assessment strategies to suit my students' needs based on the context of each class. When teaching a foreign language, assessments focused on everyday communication skills, such as ordering at a restaurant and making polite requests. In my Community ESL classes, assessments were mainly informal and designed to help students identify their strengths and areas of improvement, especially because many worked long hours and had little time for homework. In contrast, teaching in an Intensive English Program means students are expected to develop academic language skills.

I personally love using formative assessments because they pinpoint areas where students still struggle and concepts I need to teach better in a low-stakes way. These assessments can reduce the stress often associated with traditional testing, foster a positive learning experience, and help me connect with my students on a deeper level and learn from their stories. When we engage in a project, students can unleash their creativity, transforming assessment into a celebration of their growth. Writing the no-prep activity cards for assessment gave me the opportunity to try to capture the essence of some of these projects that I have worked on with my students.

## Honoring Multilingualism

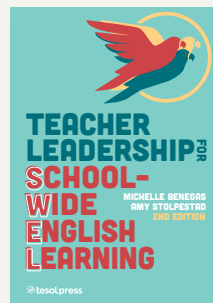
Translanguaging is deeply meaningful to me because of the profound role language plays in shaping identity and culture, building relationships, and creating inclusive spaces for learning. My connection to translanguaging stems from a combination of personal experiences, observations in teaching, and a commitment to equitable education.

I grew up in San Antonio, Texas, USA, where I saw firsthand how translanguaging happened commonly and naturally. As an adult living in other places where at first I had limited connection to the language, like Hungary, Germany, and Catalonia, translanguaging allowed me to connect with those whose language and culture I was learning, living, and teaching in.

In my teaching experience, I've seen the power of translanguaging in classrooms where students speak multiple languages. When students are encouraged to use their full linguistic repertoire, they demonstrate a deeper understanding of concepts, increased confidence, and greater engagement in the classroom community. For many of my students, language is tied to their sense of self and family history. Encouraging translanguaging honors their unique perspectives and supports a more equitable learning environment. It allows them to build on their strengths, rather than focusing on perceived deficits.

Ultimately, translanguaging is important because it challenges the traditional, monolingual biases that often undergird education systems. It emphasizes that language is fluid, dynamic, and deeply connected to how people make sense of the world. For me, it's a way to ensure that all learners feel seen, valued, and empowered to succeed.
