TESOL - What to do if you are pulled over by a police officer?

True or False

- 1. When a police officer is following your car and turns on his/her flashing lights, you should pull over to the left. (false)
- 2. After you pull over, you should get out of the car. (false)
- 3. Keep you hands on the steering wheel when you stop and wait for the officer to talk with you. (True)
- 4. Give the police officer your identification (driver's license), proof of insurance for your vehicle and car registration (Note: tabs on your car are not enough but your car must have tabs or you might get a ticket) (true)
- 5. Don't' argue with the police officer. (True)
- 6. You must pay the police officer immediately if you receive a ticket for a violation of the law. (False)

Put these activities in order.

Cut these activities into strips of paper - one sentence each - for students to use their thinking skills to determine in what order each action should happen.

- Pull my vehicle over to the right side of the road, away from traffic.
- Do not get out of the car. Keep you hands on the steering wheel.
- Answer the officer's questions (Note "have you been drinking?" is a question specifically about alcoholic beverages.)
- Ask the officer if you can get your Identification out of your pocket/purse/glove compartment.
- Do not argue with the police officer about a violation.
- Do not pay the officer for a ticket but read the ticket for information about when fines are due and if you want to protest the ticket, how to do so.
- Present my driver's license, vehicle registration and insurance documents.
